Teleconference Experiment is A Great Success!

Sandy Schlitt, Vice Chairman of Board, Aerospace Education, and Buck Buckwalter, AFA Executive Vice President, held the first National AFA Education Teleconference on September 8th 2009. Objectives were to open up a new line of Education communications to the AFA Field, answer any education questions that might arise, and determine if a National teleconference approach to communications and education linkages was useful. Forty AFA Field Education officers and supporters participated on-line. Buckwalter presented a thorough update on *CyberPatriot* and answered a number of questions. Other issues raised and discussed included continuing current Pitsenbarger awards in light of new GI Bill education support, *Visions of Exploration* successes, challenges, and attempts to obtain new sources of funding to expand the program. One concern expressed was that Visions lessons were not structured enough, requiring too much individual local adjustment by teachers. *USA Today* responded with a revised set of more structured Visions lessons. Feedback from teleconference attendees afterward strongly endorsed continuing this forum and offered constructive suggestions for improvement (audio quality and earlier agendas). USA TODAY Sponsors a Free Lunch

USA Today, our partner in the *Visions of Exploration* program, sponsored a free lunch for sixty delegates during the Air & Space Conference and Technology Convention in Washington DC. The luncheon was held at the Gaylord Resort and Convention Center's Pienza Bella Vista Restaurant at noon on September 12th. Debby Dodge, *USA Today* liaison, provided handouts and shared information on the new *Visions of Exploration* STEM program for the year. She related that *USA Today* contracted with STEM educators in and around the Virginia/Fairfax county area that are classroom teachers – and asked them to help write new lesson plans. The result is eight brand new STEM lessons this year with a Teacher and Student edition. Dodge said that she knew teachers will be pleased. She was in Charleston, South Carolina, several weeks ago at an AFA chapter meeting (they are planning to participate in *Visions* for the first time this year) and had the opportunity to visit with four local school district administrators. They reviewed the lessons and provided excellent feedback. Dodge thinks the new lesson plans will be well received by teachers this coming year. She also pointed out that *Visions* was built on teacher feedback and that *USA Today* does “listen” and work hard at improving this great education program year after year.

Florida Educator Honored

Lt Col Sharon Branch, Senior Aerospace Science Instructor at Dr. Phillips High School in Orlando, Florida, recently received a richly deserved AFA Florida State Presidential Citation for exemplary volunteer service and leadership.

Sharon acts as the liaison for the Kitty Hawk Air Society and AFJROTC and served as volunteer coordinator for the Annual AFJROTC Drill Meet Competition for the State of Florida. In that role, she managed procurement, preparation and presentation of all AFJROTC Drill Meet Trophies sponsored by individuals and AFA Chapters in Florida.

Colonel Branch brought her FL-881 cadets to compete as “Team Schriever” in the *CyberPatriot I* competition demonstration and is fielding a team in this year's *CyberPatriot II* competition.

CyberPatriot II – Soon in a high school near you

On 7 November 2009, in 44 states, D.C., and Japan, roughly 200 teams of AFJROTC and CAP high school students will gather around a computer, enter a password, and begin the largest live high school cyber defense competition ever conducted. AFA's *CyberPatriot II* is still a "proof of concept" initiative, but 7 November will be a giant leap – and on 26 September an important event reassured us that the leap was possible.

The technology for this remarkable initiative is being provided by Science Applications International Corporation (SAIC), a Founding Partner of *CyberPatriot*. Four teams from two schools, Metro HS in Columbus, OH, and Choctawhatchee HS in Fort Walton Beach, FL, downloaded a virtual image, unlocked the contents using the password provided at the start of the exercise, connected their systems to a scoring server in San Diego, CA, via a web interface, and then proceeded to compete. Their goal was to remove the vulnerabilities that were pre-configured in the Competition Image. The ability to securely connect hundreds of schools simultaneously via the internet and conduct cyber defense exercises opens the door to more routine games for everyone. This BETA test was conducted to prove the technology and procedures in preparation for the actual *CyberPatriot II* competition in November. At that time, 200-plus schools will compete in Qualification Rounds using the same basic technology and procedures. The top 25 schools will again compete remotely to determine which eight will travel to Orlando in February for the final Face-to-Face Round.

The winning BETA test team is: Metro High School Team Three, Code Name BACON, achieving a score of 100% in 1 hour and 44 minutes and 13 seconds; Congratulations!

CyberPatriot Website Data

Do you ever wonder how many people are visiting the *CyberPatriot* website? Are students really interested in participating in the program? Enter Duane Williams from the University of Texas at San Antonio (UTSA). Williams recently furnished statistics from the *CyberPatriot* website that UTSA is hosting.

For the month of July, Williams said that the website had 18,852 hits, 1,758 unique visitors (unique source addresses), 2,107 visits (some of the above visited more than once), and 4.04 GB in traffic.

The top five source countries for page views were: the United States with 4,698, Germany with 441, EU with 114, Japan with 67, and the United Kingdom with 61.

In nominating Dalzell for the AFA award, Falcon School District 49 Superintendent David Bond cited her Space Foundation role as a Teacher Liaison and her incorporation of space themes into her classroom.

He wrote: "Ms. Dalzell understands the need for our country to build upon students' passions and the needs of our space industry. Her life science lessons always bring in an element of space science and education that can be connected to real life ... Ms. Dalzell received a grant through the Air Force Association ... that allowed her to purchase Estes rockets. Knowing that learning takes place when it is connected to real-

life experiences, Ms. Dalzell secured a special guest speaker from Mission Control at Cape Canaveral to kick off the day of the rocket launches.”

Dalzell will use her Teacher of the Year award money to purchase Estes rockets and some reusable materials for her classroom. “I also tell my students the next astronaut is sitting in middle school somewhere now. They just love that!”

AFA Texas Earle North Parker Essay Contest Winner
