#### **AFA Mission**

- Our mission is to promote dominant U.S. Air and Space Forces as the foundation
  of a strong National Defense; to honor and support our Airmen, Guardians, and
  their Families; and to remember and respect our enduring Heritage.
- To accomplish this, we have three mission strategic pillars:
  - **EDUCATE** the public on the critical need for unrivaled aerospace power and promote aerospace and STEM education for a technically superior and professional workforce to ensure national security
  - <u>ADVOCATE</u> and <u>Promote</u> aerospace power to favorably shape policy and resourcing decisions to guarantee the strongest aerospace forces in the world
  - <u>SUPPORT</u> Airmen, Guardians and the families of the Total Air Force and Space Force, including Active Duty, National Guard, Reserve, civilians, families, and members of the Civil Air Patrol



What – is AFA Advocacy

**ADVOCATE** - Promote aerospace power to favorably shape policy and resourcing decisions to guarantee the strongest aerospace forces in the world

- Goal: Provide elected officials with information on the AFA and how the AFA
  provides a focus on the Top Issues that support our Airmen, Guardians, their
  families, and our Veterans.
- The AFA's ability to influence policy is only as powerful as the <u>number</u> of people involved. That is why serving as an <u>Involved Leader</u> is not just your advocacy initiative, it's about engaging and encouraging other AFA members to become advocates as well.



#### **Knowledge and Awareness**

- Ensure AFA members are aware of the AFA structure and mission
- Provide awareness of the AFA and the AFA mission areas to Community Members, Influencers, and Elected Officials
  - Neighbors and Associates
  - Service Organizations, Chambers of Commerce, School Boards
  - Defense Contractors, Businesses,
  - Military Affairs organizations, other Associations
  - Local, State, and US Elected Officials
- Be sure to discuss your positive military experiences and resulting benefits – always generates conversation and promotes military service



#### Who – should Advocate

- All AFA members should actively promote the AFA mission and AFA Legislative positions (See https://www.afa.org/advocate/)
- Schedule Advocacy as a key topic at Chapter meetings and in newsletters
- Represent the AFA when in Community settings
- Be ready to promulgate your military story and positive experiences to Community influencers and leaders
- Always be prepared to reach out to Local, State, and National Elected Officials



How to Advocate: In the Community

- Identify Community Influencers and Elected officials
- Learn about the officials' committees, interests, trends, and records
- Attend meetings with Community Influencers and Elected officials
  - Always introduce yourself as an AFA member and an Advocate
  - Develop professional relationships
  - Relay your positive experiences and the benefits of military service
  - Invite Community members and Elected officials to attend Chapter functions
  - Always invite Community members and Elected officials to become members of the AFA

## AFA Field Advocacy How to Advocate: Chapter Advocacy



**Objective:** Promote AFA positions and information with elected officials, community influencers and members through interface with Field members

Meetings with Elected Officials and their Staff:

- Schedule dedicated meetings with the elected official and their staff
- Provide leave behind copies of the AFA Legislative positions
- Discuss AFA positions. Be ready to illustrate the importance of the positions and highlight the impacts for our Air and Space Forces
- Be prepared to conduct follow-up meetings, provide additional information, and address open questions
- Refer the elected official and staff to AFA VP Legislative Affairs for WDC follow-up

Ask: Request the elected official to be aware of AFA positions and their impacts

- Solicit feedback and follow-up plans
- Provide feedback to the Advocacy Committee and the AFA VP Legislative Affairs
